

 - → "Concept of the Corporation"(1946) **Privatization Knowledge workers**




Management (1974) Management for Non Profit Organization (1991)

Ford GM the age of mass production Scientific management Human alienation





• For organization, when they tend to take advantage in the market, keeping freedom and sustainability *as a compensation* of social contribution are essential.






Drucker's contribution
